

Fr. Goetz Named Principal of MUHS

Marquette High School has a new Principal. Fr. Gerald Goetz, S.J., was named Principal of Marquette High School this past summer by Fr. Bruce Biever, S.J., Provincial of the Wisconsin Province of Jesuits. Fr. Goetz has replaced Fr. Frank Majka, S.J., who was Principal of Marquette High for two and a half years. Fr. Majka is now involved in the Campus Ministry Program at Marquette University as Chaplain in McCormack Hall.

Fr. Goetz is well acquainted with Marquette High School. He served his Regency as a Jesuit scholastic at MUHS from 1968-1970. After his ordination and a year of pastoral work, Fr. Goetz returned to Marquette in 1974 to teach science, theology, and head the Retreat Program. In 1976 he was named Rector of the Marquette High School Jesuit Community.

Fr. Goetz has the administrative experience and background at Marquette High School to do well in the very important job of Principal of Marquette High School. His combination of pastoral experience, teaching and administering the Jesuit Community will help him immensely. Assisting Fr. Goetz are his two veteran Assistant Principals, Mr. Larry Siewert and Mr. Michael Chaney.
